2. Registration

- The registration desk will commence operations at 8.30am and shall be manned by the conference secretariat throughout the event. Participants may choose to sign in and collect their conference kits on any of these days.

3. Oral Presentation Sessions

- Featured papers will be given an extra **10 minutes** in addition to the initial 20 minutes. Presenters will be informed via email if their respective papers have been selected.
- Any swapping of slots, even if mutually agreed between presenters, must be approved by the secretariat.

4. Coffee Breaks and Lunch

- All refreshments will be served within the conference hall during the break times shown in the schedule.
- A buffet lunch will be served at the hotel restaurant on the first day. Participants are required to display their conference identification tags in order to be seated.

5. Session Chairs

Session chairs have been selected from among those who have volunteered during the online registration process.
